Election of Elders

Elders have agreed a plan for election of Elders, considering that last year this did not happen, and Elders who had completed their term were asked to stay on, never imagining this would be for a whole year. The plan is as follows:

As from **April 1**st. list of eligible members list and nominations forms will be distributed by Elders to their pastoral list, in doing this they will arrange ways to pick up/forward the forms to the Church Secretary. Nominations will close on 2nd May, and the Church Secretary will produce a list of nominees, after which the Church Secretary and/or Minister will approach these Nominees to seek agreement on nomination. These names will be published in the Weekly Newsletter on two Sundays, and then on a Sunday to be determined, after the Service, we will hold a short church meeting where voting will take place, Only Church Members can vote, and votes will be those present and those who cannot come to church who have sent in their voting paper.

This weekend the process for electing new Elders begins a new stage. Nominations close on Sunday and then a list of nominees will be prepared, and we will be approaching those on the list to see if they would be willing to be nominated for election. It is for these steps that I call on each and all of you to reflect and pray. We do need to elect 10 people, some could be nominated for their second period, others will be proposed for their first time, or again after some years. This is where it becomes complicated. PLEASE consider, if you are approached, whether you could say "YES". Eldership is one of the characteristics of our identity as Reformed Churches, and without the needed number of Elders it makes the running of the church exceedingly difficult. We really do need you to consider the possibility, without a "NO" being your first thought. There have been some Elders who last year agreed to stay on for a time, given COVID, probably never imagining that time would be a whole year. To you our deepest thanks and appreciation. It is important and we do need all human help we can get, convinced that God will walk with the team, but there must be a team. (Robert)

<u>Christian Aid Week</u> – this year it will be 10-16 May, and due to the restrictions over the last year, as all Charities, Christian Aid needs all the help we can give them. The Sunday we resume worship (16Th May) is the last day of this Christian Aid week, so if you are coming to church, bring your donation, there will be envelops for you. We are also circulating envelops, less than the usual in past years, so if you have one and wont be attending worship let us know, and we will make sure it is counted, and if you don't get an envelope but wish to contribute – let us know, we will make sure your contribution is counted as well. Thank you!

One can at a time: Last week we mentioned the death of Ray who together with Wally, collected cans for charity (Cancer Research UK). I was impressed when during the service, Wally mentioned the collection, and asked Wally to share this for the Newsletter. Hope you find this as inspirational as I did (Robert) "Ray and I started saving empty drinks cans about 10 years ago, I think. We took them to a big container at Tesco and got Clubcard points for them, but it took a long time as we put in each can individually. We then took them to Thamesdown Recycling and could get about £20 for a car full. All the proceeds go to Cancer Research U K. We did very well until the first lock down and then the company no longer took cans and the price for them dropped so much, we only got £3 for a car load. We now take them to European Metal Recycling and the price is slowly increasing again. Really sadly, Ray passed away the week we hit £3,000 for the cans. I now intend to carry on the aluminium can recycling in his memory".

<u>Resuming worship at Immanuel</u>: after consulting with the members on their lists, Elders met through Zoom to consider the way forward. There were a few different responses on the matter, and the decision is to return to worship on <u>Sunday 16th May at 10.30</u>. This is the Sunday before Pentecost, allowing us all to prepare for the celebration of Pentecost. We will also celebrate Communion.

Of course, this decision is subject to no further changes on the "roadmap" set out by the Government and guidelines from the URC. It is also subject to having enough people to staff the services as needed. The use of masks and distancing is still to be complied with.

Old Town Partnership of Churches. The confirmation service this year, will also be the birthday celebration of the Partnership. We will celebrate at Christ Church on Sunday 30th May at 10.00. Bishop Viv will be with us. That Sunday this will be the only service in the Partnership Churches, due to current restriction on numbers, could you *please let me know by May 16th* if you are considering attending this service, as we must let Christ Church know in advance.
