A few weeks ago in the Reflections Robert asked us how at this 'special time' of opening-up, we picture ourselves connecting with all who live here in Old Walcot. In many situations Covid has brought people together as we've shared illness, suffering, loss, fear, isolation, grief. In return, offers of practical help and friendly chat. Barriers have been broken down; how do we make sure that it stays that way? For some, their situation and family-life will have changed for ever.

Jesus knew how to connect with people – he met them face-to-face, giving them his time and recognising their needs, - listening not judging.

So, we could make that happen by having one or two welcoming Open Days for people living in the area to come and talk to us about what it's like living here. For example, is there much unemployment; are there many young Mums or their own all day; elderly carers needing a break; dementia sufferers? And how much help is being offered already? We could discover people's thoughts about how Immanuel could play a part in their lives. Find out what are the barriers that put-off people who would like to come to a short service, to pray, to sing, to listen to A Thought for the Day. (Lots of discussion there).

It's not only up to us to find out what's going on. Covid has shown us over and over again that God's love is shown in wonderful ways by women, men and children who do not attend any church. There are also local parish councillors, Health visitors, Alzheimer's Society and Community Police who all have a concern about what goes on in the area.

In all our considerations and challenges may God be central in our thinking and speaking and doing.
