Eco-church

In order to continue our Eco-church ambitions we will be providing you with some tips for more sustainable living each week in the Newsletter. You may find that you are already doing these things, in which case you can give yourself a pat on the back.

Tip 3) Take shorter showers

The average shower time is 8 minutes, cutting this by half could save 350kg CO2 per person per year. The same amount as a return flight from London to Milan.

I have a shower timer in my bathroom which runs for 4 minutes, it's helpful as you can get lost in reverie in the shower sometimes, and it reminds you to stop!
