The Candles we light: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1; 5)



Every Sunday, as the chaplain finishes the announcements, the **Christ Candle** is lit, this is followed by a brief moment of silence, inviting Christ to be centre of our worship.

During the service, and for over six months now, each Sunday we have

been lighting the **Peace Candle**, for the war in Ukraine, but at the same time for all areas in the world where there is conflict, violence, persecution, hatred. The third candle which is usually lit when you get to church, is the **Amnesty Candle**, when we dedicate that light for all those persecuted and tortured in the world.

- Peace and Justice in all areas of conflict.
- The groups that regularly meet in each of our churches.
