The Candles we light: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1; 5)



Every Sunday, as the chaplain finishes the announcements, the **Christ Candle** is lit, this is followed by a brief moment of silence, inviting Christ to be centre of our worship.

During the service, and for over six months now, each Sunday we have

been lighting the **Peace Candle**, for the war in Ukraine, but at the same time for all areas in the world where there is conflict, violence, persecution, hatred.

The third candle which is usually lit when you get to church, is the **Amnesty Candle**, when we dedicate that light for all those persecuted and tortured in the world.

- All those affected by the terrible flooding in Pakistan, and those who are trying to help;
- the homeless, and places where they may find a safe place;
- the many people in fear of the increase of energy bills;
- the well-being of creation which is under threat;
- the work carried out by Amnesty International;
- the Old Town Partnership of Churches;
- the people who feel lonely, sad, afraid.

Tip 11) Turn off standby

Leaving devices on standby overnight equates to around 90% of their total energy use and electronics on standby account for 1% of total greenhouse gas emissions. Get into the habit of turning things off at the plug at night or when not in use. This may also help to lower your energy bills.
