Volunteer needed – Old Town Partnership of Churches

Do you have a passion for Ecumenism, a commitment to our rich heritage in Old Town of belonging to the oldest Partnership of Churches in the Country, and a couple of hours a month to spare? Immanuel needs a representative on the Old Town Partnership Focus Group. It meets monthly, and the meeting is made up of the Clergy of our Churches and one lay person from each Church, plus the officeholders: Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. Your role would be to engage with the discussions, bring any ideas/projects etc back to Immanuel and to take any comments/ideas to the Focus Group from Immanuel.

Do please give this some thought – it's an important role and not a particularly onerous one if you enjoy interacting with people and have a bit of time to spare. Please speak to Anne Farrow, Steve Brain or Robert if you would like to know more.

And a plea for help.....Swindon Domestic Abuse Support Service , through its charity shop "Survivor" in the Parade has started a joint initiative with The Harbour Project, a charity that supports refugees & asylum seekers in Swindon. Their visitors are given a $\pounds 20$ voucher to buy items from the shop (but the shop invoices Harbour for only $\pounds 10$ of every $\pounds 20$ voucher – so both charities make a contribution to, & benefit from this initiative). The scheme is going really well with many new shoppers coming in to buy items.

Most of the new visitors are single men & the shop is desperately short of warm jackets, coats, shirts, jumpers, trousers, track suit bottoms, sweatshirts & shoes. Is there anything you can do to help amongst family, friends, work colleagues etc to collect men's clothing please. Gifts may be taken along to the shop or have a word with Steve.
