This time it is Call on Iranian authorities to immediately halt the sickening execution of Ahmadreza Djalali: a Swedish-Iranian medical doctor and academic, was on a business trip to Iran when he was arrested on 26 April 2016. He is being held in the notorious Evin prison.
