He is being held in the notorious Evin prison.

Do you have a passion for Ecumenism, a commitment to our rich heritage in Old Town of belonging to the oldest Partnership of Churches in the Country, and a couple of hours a month to spare? It meets monthly – although there was some talk about meeting bimonthly before COVID struck and it doesn't usually meet in July and August. There are also the Full Partnership Council meetings -2/3 a year – which take place in the evenings. The meeting is made up of the Clergy of our Churches and one lay person from each Church, plus the officeholders: Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. Your role would be to engage with the discussions, bring any ideas/projects etc back to Immanuel and to take any comments/ideas from Immanuel to the Focus Group.
